Elections Canada: Who Should Consider Voting by Mail?

Consider voting by mail if:

- You are part of a vulnerable population;
- You are a student away from home;
- You know you will be outside of your riding during advance or election day polls and prefer not to vote early at an Elections Canada office.

Please Note:

Apply to vote by mail as soon as possible.

Your local Elections Canada office must receive your completed online or in-person **special ballot application** by the **deadline**: <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>September 14</u>, 6:00 p.m local time.

If your application is approved, you will receive a special ballot voting kit.

Plan ahead. Make sure your <u>marked special ballot</u> will get to your local Elections Canada office by the **deadline**: <u>election day September 20, 2021</u>, before the polls close in your riding.

Once you apply to vote by mail, this is the only way you can vote. You cannot vote at a polling place. You can vote only once per election.
